

Servicing

- To avoid personal injury, disconnect power to the light and allow the unit to cool down before performing maintenance.
- Perform visual, electrical, and mechanical inspections on a regular basis. The environment and frequency of use should determine this. However, it is recommended that checks should be made at least once a year. Frequency of use and environment should determine this.
- The external glass should be cleaned periodically to ensure continued luminaire performance. Clean the glass with a clean, damp, non-abrasive, lint-free cloth. If this is not sufficient, use a mild soap or a liquid cleaner. Do not use an abrasive, strong alkaline or acid cleaner as damage may occur.
- Inspect the cooling fins on the luminaire to ensure that they are free of any contamination (i.e. excessive dust build-up). Clean with a non-abrasive cloth if needed.
- Mechanically check to make sure all parts are properly assembled.
- Electrically check to make sure that all connections are clean and tight.

Electrical Connection

- 1. Loosen the three M5 Socket head cap screws with spring washers of Tank Cover with torque value 5 N-m.
- 2. The thread of entry hole of Tank is 3/4" NPT. Attach the Tank to suitable conduit.
- 3. Insert the wire from outside through the conduit and the entry hole of Tank, and then connect to Terminal Block.
- 4. Introduce the wires of branch circuit as following:

Black-wire connects to Line

White-wire connects to Neutral


Green-wire connects to Ground

5. Re-attach the Tank Cover and tight it by three M5 Socket head cap screws with spring washers with torque value 5 N-m.

Wall/Ceiling/Floor Mounting Bracket

- 6. Check the tightness of conduit and Tank Cover.
- 7. The mounting bracket is for the use of wall/ceiling/floor mounting.
- 8. Position the mounting bracket and fix it by means of two M6 and two M8 hexagon bolts with spring lock washers.
- 9. Secure the wall/ceiling/floor mounting bracket to the structure by using screws (not provided) (Fig. 1).




Figure 2 Figure 3

- 10. The luminaire can be adjusted up and down by 45° on wall/floor position only. (Fig. 2)
- 11. The luminaire can be adjusted facing down 90° from vertical = Lens horizontal facing down on ceiling position (Fig. 3).





Wall Mount Floor Mount Ceiling Mount

- 12. The luminaire is installed with DN20 steel pipe.
- 13. Fix the luminaire with M5 screws with torque value 4 N-m. (Fig.4)


